

**ANTI-CORRUPTION ORGANISATION****November 2019 Report****Highlights**

- One (01) new complaint file opened this month
- AC hotline received 15 calls this month
- Preliminary hearings opened in the case pitting vendors of the Mokolo market against the commissioner of police of Yaounde II, Mokolo
- Health Corruption hotline received 6 calls this month

**General**

The AC hotline phone received 15 calls this month of November 2019 with six (06) corruption complaints and five (05) non-corruption related complaints registered.

One (01) new case file was opened this month

A new case file on Influence Trafficking was opened this month. The complainant complained that a case of many counts he deposited at the military tribunal of Yaounde against a gendarmerie commander involving acts of corruption, oppression and threats, in case of brevity, has been thrown out of the court with no justification. He believes that, the examining magistrate to whom the case file was given has been influenced by the accused, since she requested that he sought to settle amicably with the accused and, asked why he would want to destroy the career of a 'soldier of the nation' who has served the country for years and is on his way out to retirement. AC is still pursuing investigations in this case.

Preliminary inquiries were opened at the First Instance Court of Ntui where the first group of victims were heard, in the corruption case involving many counts with about three hundred victims deposited at the court of First Instance in the Yaounde Administrative Center in the month of August 2017. In this light, two victims were heard and the president of the court requested that the victims present certain documents of their Association for the continuation of the legal procedure.

**AC Hotline Phone**

The AC hotline phone received 15 calls this month of November 2019 with six (6) corruption and corruption related complaints, and registered five non-corruption complaints.

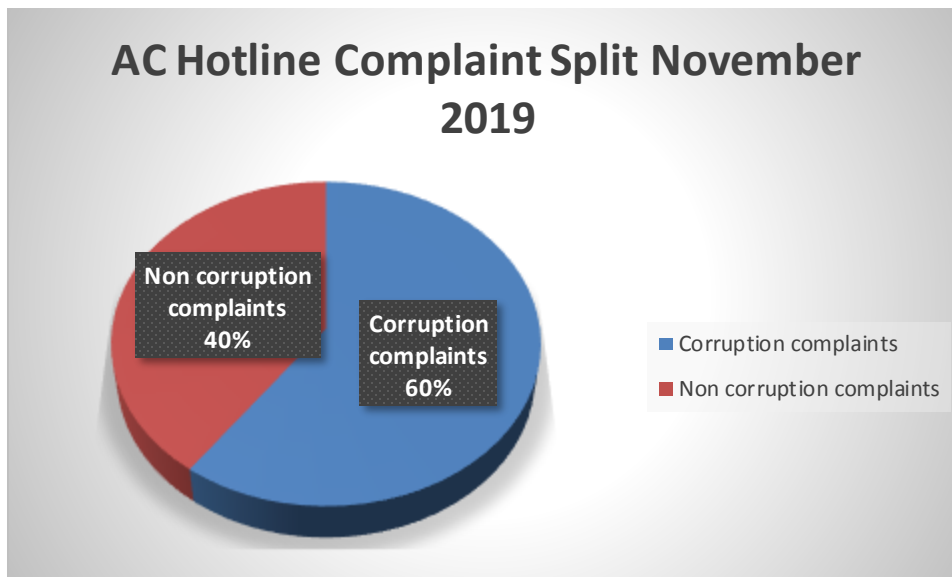

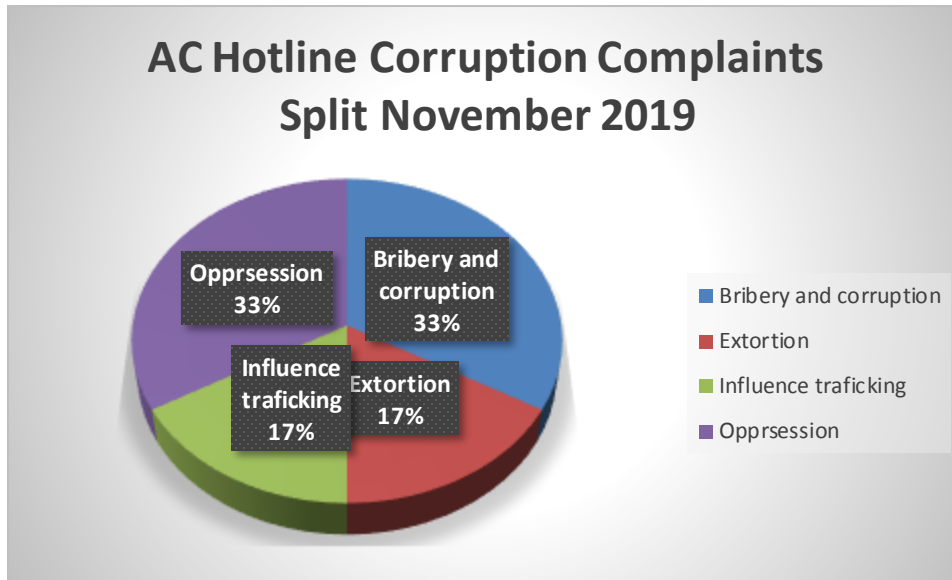
The calls have been analyzed and represented on charts as seen below;



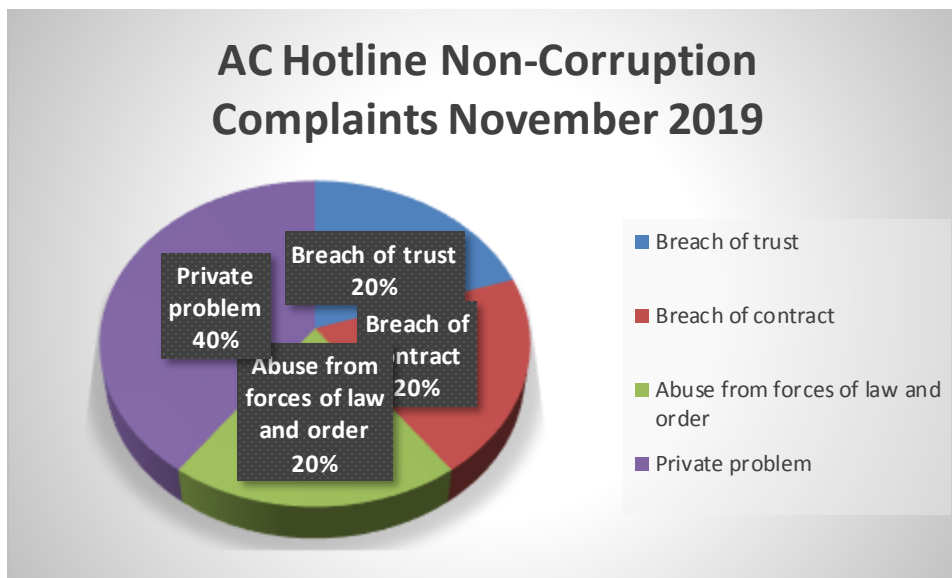
Responsive calls were represented by 73% of calls this month of November 2019 while non responsive calls were represented by 27% of calls



This month of November 2019, corruption complaints were represented by 60% of complaints while complaints not related to corruption were represented by 40% of complaints

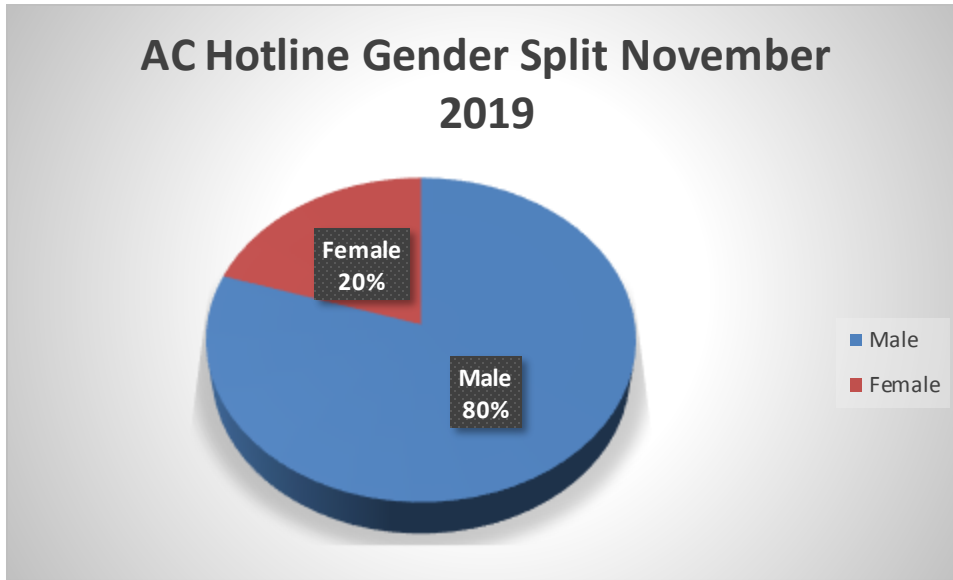


Complaints against bribery and corruption and oppression both represented 33% each of corruption complaints while complaints of extortion and influence trafficking both represented 17% each of corruption complaints



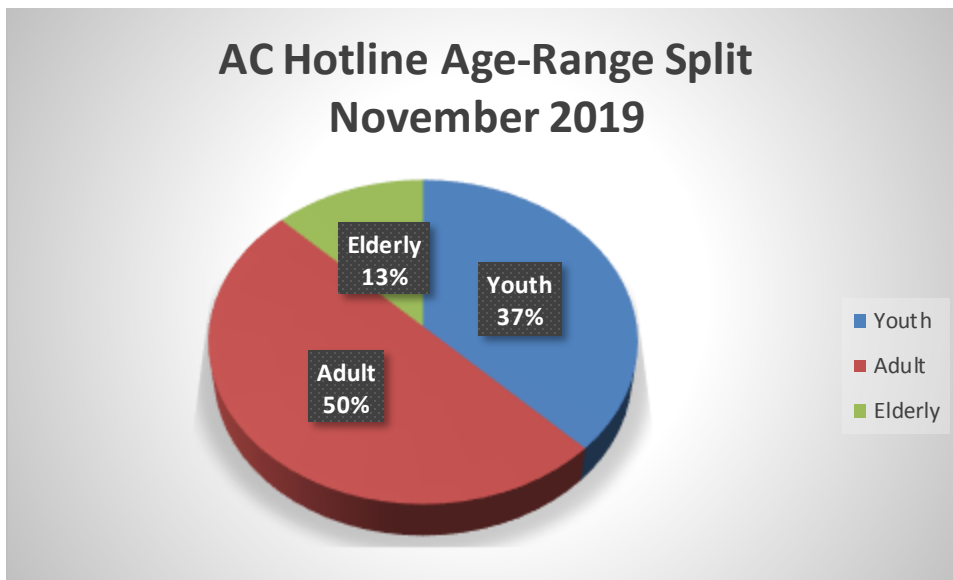
This month of November 2019, callers with private problems were represented by 40% of complaints while complaints of abuse suffered from forces of law and order, breach of trust and breach of contract all represented 20% each of non corruption complaints

### Gender



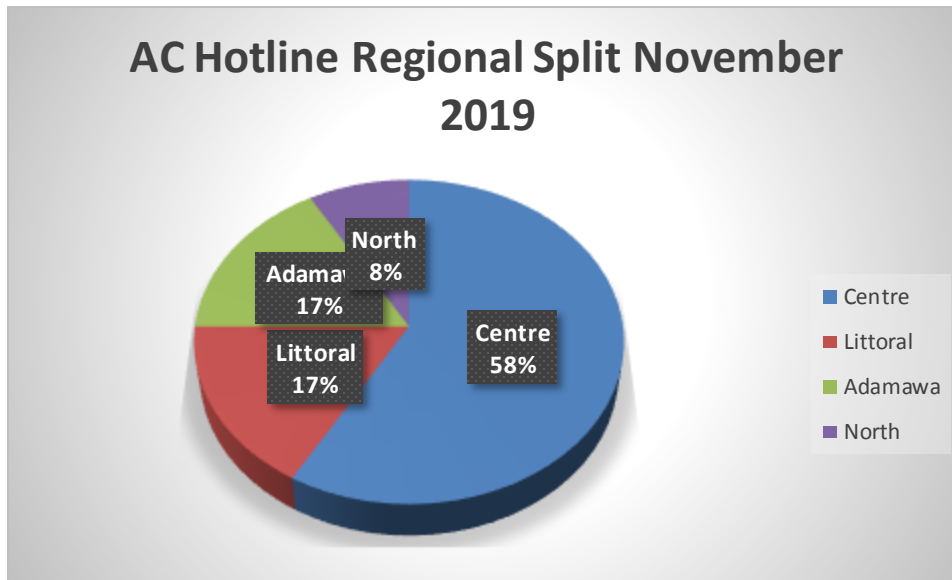
The male gender participated with 80% of callers this month of November 2019 while the female gender participated with just 20% of callers

### Age range of callers



The adult age range participated with 50% of callers, followed by the youth age range which participated with 37% of callers and lastly, the elderly age range which participated with 13% of callers

## Regional representation



The Centre region participated with the most number of callers represented by 58% of callers, followed by the Littoral and the Adamawa regions which participated with 17% each of callers and lastly, the north region with 8% of callers

## Investigations

Investigations are ongoing in a new complaint file on Influence Trafficking opened this month. The complainant, reported a judge of the military tribunal of Yaounde for conniving with a commander to throw out of the court a corruption case he deposited against the commander.

According to the complainant, a theft occurred in his shop where the thieves made away with about 475,000 F CFA worth of goods and cash. He made a complaint at the gendarmerie and the thieves were identified but the commander refused to follow up with the case without him paying him 40,000 F CFA first. He refused to pay the money solicited by the commander and informed the commander that it was his right as a citizen to request for the services of law enforcement officers without bribing them and this got the commander enraged to the extent that he pulled out his gun and threatened the complainant, asking him to leave his office or he'll shoot him and added that he can take him to the highest court in the land if he so cares.

He deposited a complaint at the military court against the commander in a bid to seek justice for the loss incurred just for the judge to ask him after a series of postponement of hearings, to seek amicable settlement with the commander and not destroy the end of his career and his life along

with it. AC plans to effect an investigative visit to the military tribunal in order to verify the facts of the complaint and follow up on the case.

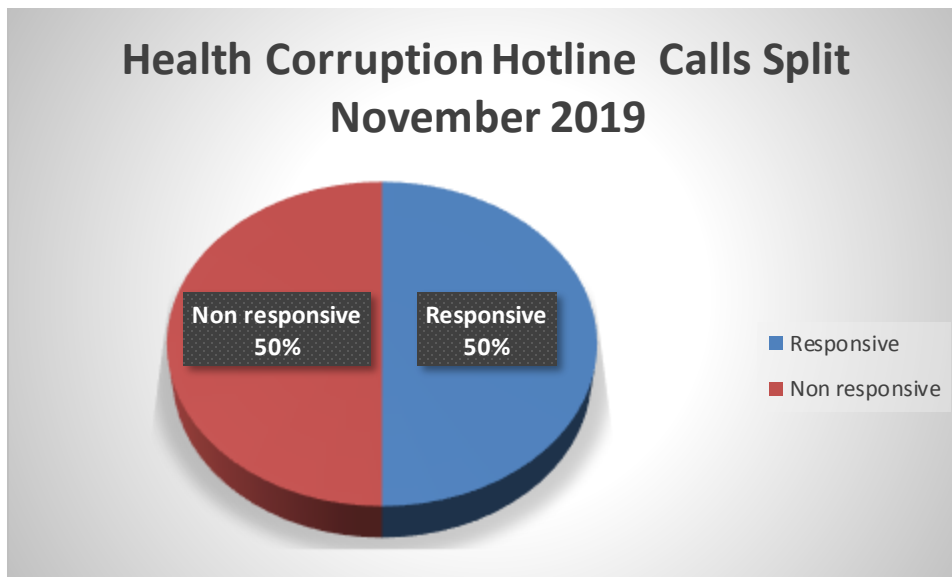
### Legal follow-up

Case follow-up continued this month in the corruption case involving many counts with about three hundred victims deposited at the court of First Instance in the Yaounde Administrative Center in the month of August 2017. Preliminary inquiries were opened at the First Instance court of Ntui and two of the victims were heard in this regard. After the hearings, the president of the court requested that the victims present certain documents pertaining to their Association for the continuation of legal procedure.

### Health Corruption Hotline

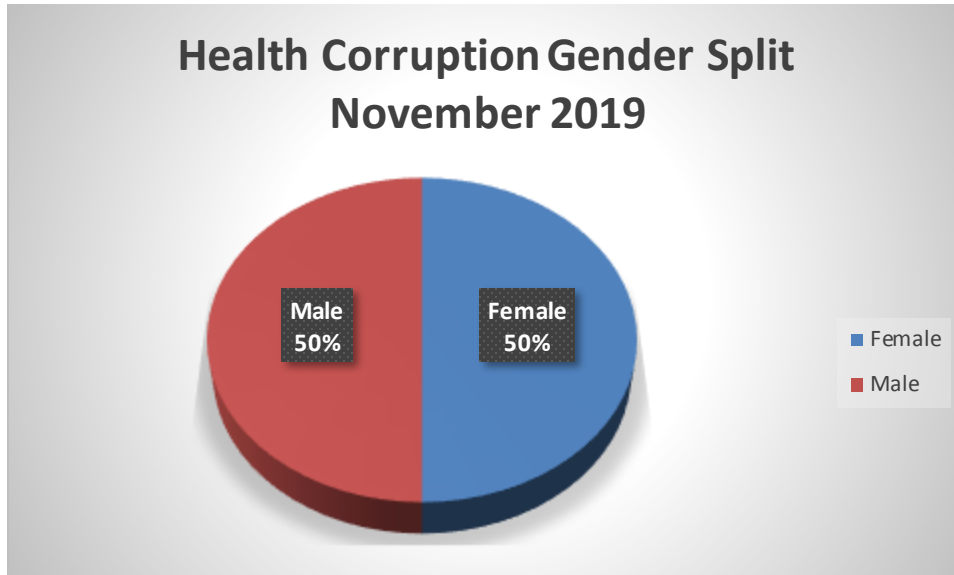
The Health Corruption hotline received 6 calls this month of November 2019 registering one non-corruption complaint.

Data from the calls has been analyzed and represented on charts as seen below.



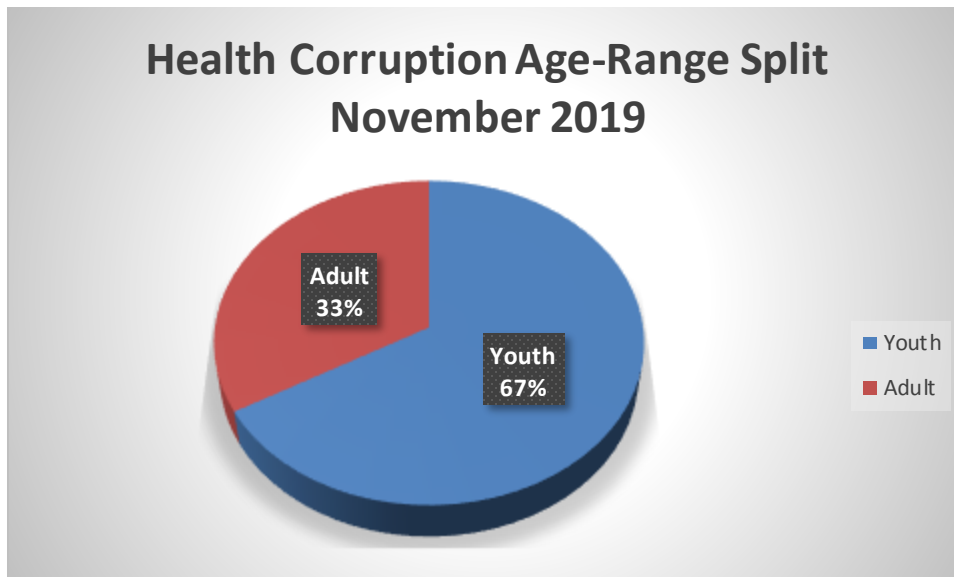
Both responsive calls and non responsive calls were represented by 50% of callers

### Gender



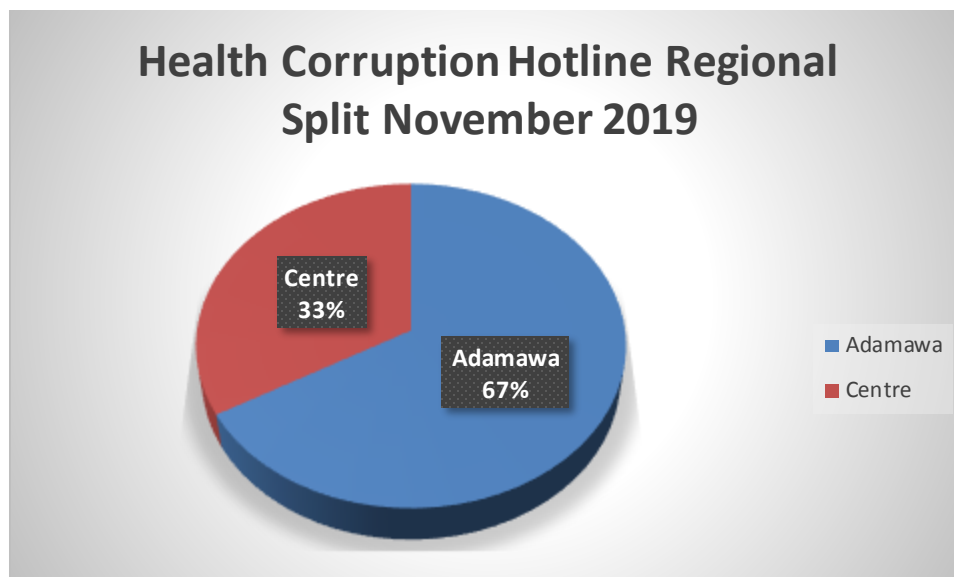
Both the male and female gender participated with 50% each of Health Corruption calls this month of November 2019
